MURP/MPA DUAL DEGREE

The MURP/MPA dual degree program requires a total of **91 credits**, and coursework in the two disciplines can be taken concurrently or sequentially. Students completing the program receive **two separate master degrees**, an **MURP** and an **MPA**. If students elect to complete only one degree at any time in the program, they must then meet all requirements for that individual degree.
